

The SAC and the Argentine Congress of Cardiology in the World

We live in a fully interconnected world. The influence of other societies is unquestionable, despite economic and cultural differences. Undoubtedly, the reality of conditions such as Chagas disease and rheumatic heart disease is very different in the northern hemisphere compared to the south. However, those societies need our expertise and we need their support in this and other matters. In a globalized world, we all need each other: knowledge, and the need to learn and give our very best, recognize no boundaries.

Exchange among societies from other latitudes becomes increasingly relevant in congresses. Nowadays, it would be inconceivable to organize a congress without the participation of colleagues from other parts of the world.

The Argentine Society of Cardiology (SAC) finally stands on the threshold of a new congress, returning to face-to-face attendance. The challenge we talked about in the first issue of our journal has been realized, with strong involvement by our members, who are enthusiastically looking forward to the high-quality event we always use to have, and also by the societies with which we have an active relationship and which will be part of our scientific program.

More than 280 research papers will be shared in order to learn from the experience of others.

In brief, the congress offers us this renewed post-pandemic experience to increase our personal and group growth, learn from others, and help others learn.
